
#### Stay safe and alert

#### Calls to have your say on Government reforms to planning system



The public are being urged to have their say on Government plans to 'streamline and modernise' the planning process.

Proposals include reforms to the 'local plan' system and making greater use of digital technology in the planning process.

The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government said its 'Planning for the Future' reforms would allow local planning authorities to designate land into one of three categories: for growth, renewal or protection.

It is proposed that land identified for growth would be approved for development at the same time as plan preparations, allowing for new housing and other important infrastructure to be "built quickly and efficiently", providing plans meet local design standards.

Protected land – including the green belt – will continue to be safeguarded under the proposals.

Alongside this consultation, the Government is carrying out a technical consultation on 'Changes to the Current Planning System'. This focuses on changes to the current planning system ahead of proposals made in the Planning White paper

- changes to the standard method for assessing local housing need
- securing of First Homes through developer contributions
- · temporarily lifting the small sites threshold
- extending the current Permission in Principle to major development

Your comments will feed into the Local Plan and help us protect existing open spaces and how we can assess demand for more in the future.

#### Plans underway for a Christmas with a difference to help boost shops

Plans are underway to organise an 'alternative' Christmas – with a Victorian theme – to give local businesses a much-needed boost.

In what has been a hugely challenging year for shops and businesses, Harborough District Council will work with local businesses and retail groups with a view to staging a series of alternative Christmas events.

Unfortunately, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the traditional Christmas lights switch on in Market Harborough, which has attracted big crowds annually, cannot go ahead. However, the Christmas tree on The Square and festive lights for the town will be installed as usual to kick off the festive season from the 20 November 2020, as well as the small trees above shop fronts.

Proposals for a Victorian Christmas market are also being explored, as well as Late Night Shopping, children's Victorian trail, fancy dress and photography competition, window dressing competition, and a festive 'shop local' campaign, as a further boost to the local economy.

In addition to supporting Market Harborough's Victorian Christmas, Harborough District Council is also looking to support businesses in other towns and villages to help maximise the opportunities to encourage people to 'shop local' at this important time of year for the retail sector.

#### Keep a 'warm home' during the cold weather with fully-funded heating





Does your home need extra insulation to keep out the chills as the weather gets colder?

If so, you could benefit from the Leicestershire Warm Homes Fund initiative run by Leicestershire County Council in partnership with E.ON and Age UK.

The project will primarily offer the installation of fully funded, first-time gas central heating for up to 500 homeowners and tenants.

Even if you're not connected to gas the initiative can help.

In addition, eligible residents may be able to receive free insulation measures for their homes, as well as benefit from free energy efficiency advice and support on how to better manage their income from Age UK.

Traders at Harborough Indoor Market have thanked shoppers for supporting them through the lockdown period and are urging the public to continue that support.

The measures that felt strange at first; floor markings, queues, one-way systems and wearing masks, have become integral to shopping, with the processes at Harborough Market receiving overwhelming support from the public, many of which complimented the staff on how safe they felt inside the market, and how important it has been to them over the past few months.

"Thank you, Harborough Market. I breezed past the supermarkets and straight to the amazing butchers, deli, cleaning products and fresh veg. All done & back home in 30 mins," said another shopper.

Traders are also urging the public to show them some on-line support. Harborough District Council has organised two social media training sessions for stallholders in a bid to help them promote their business to a digital audience.

#### Chance to apply for funding if your local project meets the criteria



Do you know of a project that is aiming to promote a healthy, inclusive & engaged community - or a village hall, sports hall or community centre that needs support to reopen?

If so, there is funding available through Harborough District Council's Community Grant Fund.

The Community Grant Fund is an inclusive fund, open to all parishes, plus voluntary and community groups.

The amount available is £25,000 (grant limit between £1,000 and £5,000).

Projects must support one or more of the objectives below:

· Improvements or provision of outdoor facilities



- Youth related capital projects such as sports or arts, equipment or facilities
- Improving the environment

Please note: Groups that have previously received funding within the last 3 years will not be eligible.

The deadline for applications is **Friday 25 September 2020.** 

People can also apply for a small grant that will help village halls, sports halls or community centres reopen.

Grants of up to £500 are available to fund signage, plastic screens for bars, line marking, outdoor seating, additional cleaning supplies, or PPE where deemed necessary.

The amount available is £13,000 (grant limit £500).

The deadline for applications is **Friday 18 September 2020**

#### Young resident's poster impresses so much it's turned into park signs

We decided to have these designs made into Correx posters and placed around Little Bowden recreation ground.

Our contractors at FCC have also put together a goodie bag for Cameron (pictured) as a show of thanks for his help and showing awareness towards environmental crime issues.

The goodie bag consisted of a 'hi-vis', a set of pens, a large box of bio-degradable dog bags that can be handed out to residents, an Amazon voucher and a copy of his poster.

This was delivered (socially distanced) to his doorstep by our Environmental Services Manager and Senior Environmental Services Officer.

Cameron was delighted and pleasantly surprised upon receiving this.





# More detail if building hours to be extended

Developers who request extensions to construction working hours, must provide much greater detail on why the extension is needed and how local disruption will be minimised under new measures.

In May 2020, the Government announced that construction working hours should be extended, in agreement with the local authority, to help progress building projects which had been halted by the Covid-19 pandemic.

It aims to promote safe working in line with social distancing guidance and stagger the number of workers on any building site at any time.

Now the Government has formalised the process requiring developers, who apply to extend working hours, to provide much greater detail to justify why the extension is needed and what will be done to minimise local disruption.

# Changes to parking permit discount

Changes to long stay permit charges in our Harborough district car parks come into effect on 4 September 2020.

This follows a decision made as part of the last review of the Parking Order in 2017 to reduce the discount for car park permits from 40% to 33% in 2020.

This still represents a considerable saving on the daily charge of £4.00, reducing the cost to £2.70 on a six-day annual permit.

No other fees are affected by this change and there will be no increase in the hourly or daily rate for parking.


