The aim is to encourage more parishes to think about how they use their village hall more regularly throughout the day whilst providing extra physical activity opportunities for their residents.

We've offered a diverse range of activities including falls prevention, new age kurling and boccia sessions, which are great for people of any age and ability, and can easily be adapted for village halls across the district.

These sessions have proved extremely popular and shown greater need for more sessions around the district.

Not forgetting the added social benefit that has brought residents closer together; one resident said "We would love to have this as a more regular feature to our offering as a parish as it allows us to get to make new friends within our village."

'Lucy's Law' being introduced to protect welfare of animals

When you purchase a kitten or puppy, it is important that we help protect the welfare of these animals.

In April 2020, new laws will be introduced in England



to help combat the illegal trade in pet animals and to ensure the welfare of puppies and kittens.

'Lucy's Law' requires animals to be born and reared in a safe environment, with their mother, and be sold from their place of birth.

The new Government rules are scheduled to come into force on 6 April 2020.

Harborough District Council, as the local licensing authority, will be responsible for enforcing the new law which will mean that, going forward, puppies and kittens can no longer be sold by a third party seller – such as a commercial breeder or pet shop – unless they have bred the animal themselves.

Anyone who finds that their new pet has been imported illegally, may have to pay for costly quarantine and veterinary bills.

The campaign, run by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy, runs from 20 March to 13 April 2020, and brings together individuals, community organisations, businesses and councils to show they love where they live.

Alongside this campaign, Harborough District Council works all year round with volunteers - including the South Leicestershire Wombles.

Currently, we have over 300 volunteers across the district and take away approximately 1,200 bags - that's about 8 tonnes of collected litter - on top of our day-to-day street cleaning!

The Great British Spring Clean provides an opportunity to galvanise support for maintaining a clean environment and anyone who would like to organise a clean-up event can request litter picking equipment from the Council; we will also be on hand to pick up the bags of rubbish which are collected.
